# ARTH 2245 <u>History of Photography</u>

Sec 001 CRN 28696 Mulhearn Online \*Online

(Formally ARTH 210). This course is designed to provide students with a fundamental working knowledge of the major trends in the aesthetic, conceptual, and technical aspects of photography from its beginnings in the 1830's to the recent practices of photographers and artists working with photographic technologies. Together we will investigate photography's role as an artistic medium as a central focus, as well as its broader role in our visual, political, and social culture. Textbook readings, online lectures, discussions boards, exams, and other activities will assist students in gaining a critical understanding of photography.

**ARTS 1410 Introduction to Photography**

(Formally ARTS 187). 2nd half course - July. This course introduces the making of photographic images from a broad viewpoint to consider both as an art practice and as a cultural practice. The course covers technical information on camera use and functionality, composition and visual design, digital workflow and editing, professional functions of manipulating and enhancing images, and printing correctly and effectively. The historical aspects of photography are also covered. Foundation course designed to prepare students for ARTS 2420. Course Fee: \$210.00
