ART EDUCATION GRADUATE CURRICULUM REDESIGN

During the 2021 school year, I worked with my program to introduce changes to the art education master's degree. We revamped the graduate requirements and created more rigorous capstone research projects: an action research project, an art exhibition tied to an educational concept, art curriculum development, or a thesis.

NEW MEXICO ART EDUCATION TEACHING LICENSURE COORDINATION

I served as the art education coordinator for the UNM College of Education's national review through the Council for Educator Preparation (CAEP). Gathering data that reflects the high standards of the art education program contributed to the College of Education's positive reviews. Additionally, as the sole art teacher accreditation program in New Mexico, we are responsible for adhering to the everchanging teacher accreditation requirements set forth by the State Department of Education. One significant change in 2023-2024 is the move from required standardized tests for teacher licensure to developing a portfolio system in collaboration with UNM College of Education. These changes impacted the redesign of coursework and curriculum to address the NM PED portfolio requirements.
